About Barwon Health

Barwon Health serves a geographically dispersed population through two major sites in Geelong, as well as smaller sites stretching down the coast and Colac.

Barwon Health is one of the most comprehensive service providers in the state, covering the full spectrum from emergency and acute to mental health, primary care, community services, aged care and subacute/rehabilitation. It is the tertiary referral centre for the Western District (servicing a population of around 500,000).

Barwon Health's areas of speciality include cardiology, cardiothoracic surgery, intensive care, infectious diseases, maternity, neurology, oncology, orthopaedics, paediatrics, palliative care, psychiatry, renal medicine, respiratory medicine, and aged care.

University Hospital Geelong has approx. 450 acute inpatient beds and is located in central Geelong. The McKellar Centre, situated in North Geelong, provides residential aged care services as well as rehabilitation and palliative care.

University Hospital Geelong is a major teaching hospital associated with Melbourne, Deakin and Monash Universities.

About the Pharmacy Department

The Pharmacy Department is staffed by 119 EFT staff across University Hospital Geelong, the rehabilitation and aged care site (McKellar Centre) and the private hospital (St John of God). The staffing consists of 74 EFT pharmacists, 6 intern pharmacists and 39 support staff.

A high degree of specialisation exists in clinical pharmacy roles (e.g. cardiology, emergency, gastroenterology, general medicine, infectious diseases, intensive care, mental health, neurology, oncology, paediatrics, renal, and surgery), clinical trials, medication safety, medicines information, antimicrobial stewardship and radiopharmacy. At the McKellar Centre pharmacy provides specialised services to rehabilitation and palliative care patients.

The department has a dedicated education team, led by an experienced full-time education pharmacist and supported by two additional enthusiastic educators (2 EFT education staff across student, intern and residency programs).

The Pharmacy Department is actively involved in undergraduate and postgraduate pharmacy education. Pharmacy practice research is a focus with local and collaborative projects with universities, and other healthcare facilities.

Pharmacy is innovative in its approach to practice with robotic dispensing and inventory system. Quality use of medicines and medication safety activities are led by pharmacy across campuses. Pharmacy technicians support clinical pharmacists and undertake sterile and oncology preparation.

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Pharmacy Intern Program

The pharmacy intern program is a balance of structured learning and practical training rotations.

Until the end of August, the intern will spend time in*:

- Introductory clinical rotations (clinical orientation)
- Dispensary, as well as familiarisation to aseptic services, medicines information, medication safety, antimicrobial stewardship, oncology and radiopharmacy
- Clinical rotations through specialised ward services such as cardiology, renal, gastroenterology, neurology, rehabilitation, as well as general medical and surgical wards
- Allocated research week

In the final four months of the year the intern will*:

- Manage their own patient load, suitable to this stage of development working under indirect supervision of nominated supervisors.
- Further develop clinical and communication skills as well as time management, independence and prioritisation.
- Complete elective rotations (e.g. paediatrics, emergency, psychiatry, oncology, ICU, maternity, other Barwon South West regional hospitals)

Additional Information

- Planned intern tutorials are held once weekly for one to two hours. These sessions are steered by pharmacists within the department, as well as guest speakers, including community pharmacists and specialist nurses. The interns are expected to prepare for and contribute to sessions. Interns will also be supported in the preparation for the written and oral exams.
- Barwon Health offers an incredibly rich support network for interns, including;
 - Education team
 - Full-time education pharmacist, 0.5 EFT intern preceptor, 0.5 EFT student coordinator
 - Individual mentor pharmacist for each intern
 - Supportive pharmacy staff – including pharmacists, technicians and support staff
 - Regular and ongoing feedback and follow-up
 - Professional and/or mental health support
- Interns gain experience in conducting a research project, alongside a skilled pharmacist supervisor. In the past, a number of these projects have been presented at conferences.
- Barwon Health is an accredited Monash University 'Intern Foundation Program' site with Credentialed Clinical Educators. This program, in conjunction with the Monash Intern Training Program allows interns to complete either a Graduate Certificate or complete the Monash MPharm.
